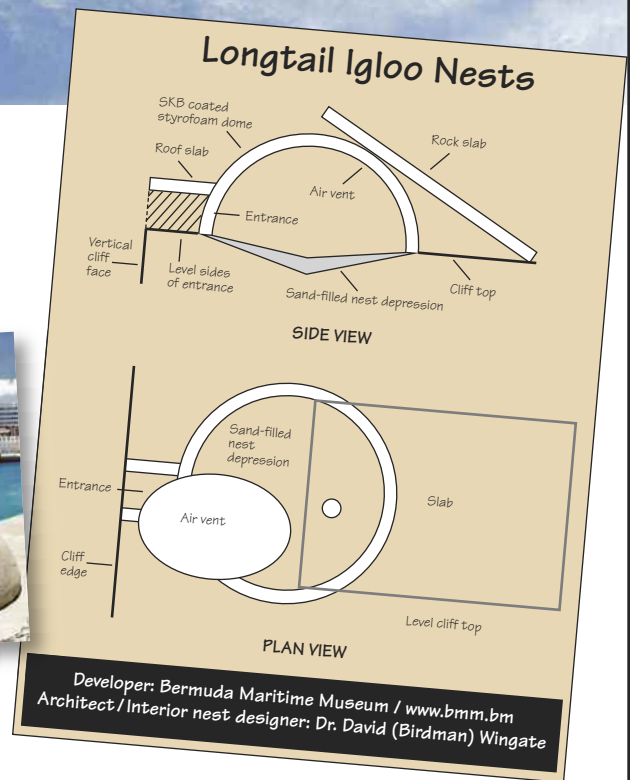

This ecologically-sensitive heritage development is intended to provide low-cost housing for a neglected minority in local waters, the "Bermuda Longtail," otherwise known as the White-tailed Tropicbird, *Phaethon lepturus catesbyi*. These Bermuda residents have been booted out of many of their traditional homes by other introduced and non-endemic species and need help maintaining freeholdings on the Island, as some of our earliest inhabitants.

Bermuda Maritime Museum will be constructing a number of Longtail nests to create a major rookery at the Dockyard. Your donation will help to protect this threatened summer resident and support the heritage work of Bermuda Maritime Museum.
